

**REVISED REQUEST FOR BIDS  
CITY OF DUNN  
2020 STREET, DRAINAGE, WATER AND SEWER IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT  
STREET IMPROVEMENTS ONLY**

Sealed proposals will be received by the City of Dunn, North Carolina until **Thursday, March 18, 2021 at 10:00 am**, then will be publicly read aloud for the construction of **“City of Dunn, 2020 Street, Drainage, Water and Sewer Improvements Project”- Street Improvements Only**.

The construction work will consist of the following areas of work and approximate quantities:

**Bay Street – Street Improvements**

**Base Bid**

Rebuild Street: 1,200 SY Geogrid, 600 Tons CABC, 170 Tons Pavement

**Alternate Bid**

Alternate Bid for use of FDR Methods on Bay Street

**Watauga Street – Street Improvements**

Street Improvements: 9,400 SY FDR. 1,150 Tons Pavement, 800 Tons CABC Wedging

Proposals must be sealed and marked **“City of Dunn, 2020 Street, Drainage, Water and Sewer Improvements Project - Street Improvements Only”** on the outside of the envelope. All proposals must be submitted upon the blank forms provided in the copies of the Proposal, Contract and Specifications.

Each Bid must be accompanied by Bid security in an amount of not less than five percent of the amount of the Bid.

No bid may be withdrawn after the scheduled closing time for receipt of Bids for a period of ninety (90) days. Any Bids received after the scheduled closing time for receipt of Bids will be returned to the Bidder unopened. The City reserves the right to retain Bids for a period of 90 days from receipt.

Consideration will be given only to Bids of Contractors who are able to submit evidence showing that they are properly licensed under "An Act to Regulate the Practice of General Contracting", ratified by the General Assembly of North Carolina on March 10, 1925, and so subsequently amended.

Small, minority, and women’s businesses and labor surplus area firms are encouraged to submit bids.

Both Performance Bond and a Payment Bond is required in an amount equal to 100 percent of the Contract price, conditioned upon the faithful performance of the Contract and upon the payment in full to all persons supplying labor and furnishing materials for and in connection with the construction of the project.

**REVISED PER ADDENDUM NO. 4**

The Owner reserves the rights to waive any informality or to reject any or all Bids.

Each Contractor submitting a Proposal for this work shall produce evidence of experience in constructing a project of similar size and nature. Contractors that are unable to produce this evidence may be rejected even if they are low Bidders.
