Water Treatment Plant Overview

- Plant was built in 1968
- Treatment Capacity 8.0 Million Gallons a Day (MGD)
- Elevated and Ground Storage = 6,000,000 gallons
- 2 Generators for Standby Power
- 8 Employees
- 24/7 Operation
- More than 1 Billion Gallons are Treated Annually
- Budget is roughly \$1.9 Million

4 MGD Raw Motor Repair and New Pump Assembly

The 4MGD Raw Motor and Pump Assembly is the primary unit used to send water from the Cape Fear River to the Treatment Plant. It is the smallest of 3 pumps at the Raw Pump Station.

Project cost was \$97,617.29.









Pump Gallery

The Water Treatment Plant has 3 High Service Pumps that send water to the Distribution System. The motor horsepower ranges from 300-500.







Ground Storage Tanks(Clearwell) Resealing

The WTP has 2 ground storage tanks, a 3 million gallon and a 1 million gallon. These tanks are not only used for storage but are also used for adequate holding time for the disinfection process. They needed repair due to cracks in the structure that could possibly allow contaminants to penetrate the concrete.

Project cost was \$103,041.00.



24 Inch Water Transmission Line

The boring of the new 24 inch Water Transmission line has started.

- **5.** Dig carefully around buried utilities.

The City's CCTV van is used to visually inspect sewer mains throughout the city to find defects as well as infiltration due to aging pipes.

 The sewer vac truck is used to keep sewer mains free of debris to insure they flow properly and prevent blockages that may cause overflows.

- Average daily flow 2 million gallons






Total Gallons of Wastewater Treated For 2023 - 804.746 Million Gallons

Total Rain Fall for 2023 - 46.64 inches


Total Million Gallons Treated





Sewer Moratorium Status

- The moratorium status is still active. The City entered into an SOC with the State on June 30, 2022 to correct sewer system deficiencies.
- SOC included 7 Sewer projects (collection system & WWTP projects).
- Flow for additional growth is allocated to the City when projects are completed.
- Quarterly reports are submitted to the State.
- SOC expires March 31, 2027

Black River WWTP Improvements Project


- Addition of 80Ft clarifier, rehab a 1980's clarifier, addition of a new chlorine contact chamber, upsize internal process piping, addition of a chemical feed system for pH control, upgrade sludge control, addition of drain pump station for clarifiers.
- Total Project Cost: \$12,482,100
- Contractor: TA Loving Inc.
- Project is Under Design-Build Contract
- Estimated Completion Date: May 2024
- Debt Service Starts: Estimated 2024~2025



- Construction of a new two and a half mile, 30-inch Force Main from the WWTP to the Cape Fear River & Replacement of Pump Station.
- Total Estimated Project Cost: \$16,100,000
- Contractor: TBD
- Estimated Bid Date: Currently ongoing
- Estimated Completion Date: Q4 2025

BRIC GRANT AWARD

- May 24, 2024 City Awarded a \$6,438,975 Building Resilient Infrastructure & Communities (BRIC) Grant
- Helps to Fund a \$9,000,000 Improvement to City Water Treatment Plant
 - Relocates the 24" Raw Water Intake line from the Cape Fear River to the Water Treatment Plant
 - Moves the Electrical Components of the Pump System out of a Flood Plain











Inspections & Code Enforcement:


- -Coordinate with homeowners, developers, builders and other City staff to ensure safe and orderly development and construction





- Games at Clarence Lee Tart Park















Dunn Police Department Organizational Chart






